## V. ORGANIZATION AND ASSIGNMENT OF RESPONSIBILITIES

1. The USNH primary responsibility is to save life and limb, through basic resuscitative methods. Transport patients from the incident scene to one of the receiving hospitals (GMH or USNH). Support responsibilities are communications, supplies, tracking.
2. Agencies required to support response operations:
  - a. Medical suppliers.
  - b. Transportation assets.
  - c. Communications assets.
  - d. Decontamination assets.
  - e. Guam Environmental Protection Agency (GEPA)
  - f. Medical Examiner
  - g. HC-5 if available
  - h. GPHSS
  - i. 36th Medical Group or USNH
  - j. Guam Public Works
  - k. COMNAVMARIANAS Public Works
3. Responsibilities shared with other agencies
  - a. GPHSS.
  - b. Guam Mental Health.
  - c. 36th Medical Group.
  - d. Guam Public Works.
  - e. GEPA.
4. Deactivation Procedures
  - a. Upon completion of the rescue phase, the Incident Commander shall release each responding team back to their respective agencies.
  - b. These teams shall be replaced by another agency or in some cases (i.e. Environmental Health) by the same agency to perform required tasks during the recovery phase.
  - c. Upon completion of the recovery phase, the Incident Commander shall release each team back to their respective agencies.

## VI. ADMINISTRATIVE AND LOGISTICS

1. The Incident Command System (ICS) coupled with any logbook type record keeping shall be utilized. Tracking of manning, supplies, vehicles, patient number and category is essential for information and support. All this information shall be relayed to the ICS command post and then

forwarded to supporting agencies.

2. Each agency shall already have their equipment and supplies inventoried prior to arrival on scene. Once on scene, these supplies and equipment shall be added to the inventory already on hand to support the medical mission. Replacement of items or additional required items shall be procured through the command post via the ICS system.

#### VII. PLANNED DEVELOPMENT AND MAINTENANCE

1. Individual agencies have their own contingency plan. These plans should be reviewed on an annual basis to ensure that they properly support the incident.
2. USNH performs a mass casualty exercise twice a year. Medical Response Team training occurs on a monthly basis. Components of the USNH perform training per their required timeframes. Joint exercises should occur on an annual basis to ensure proper command and control is performed.
