**COVID-19 Test Results: 122 New Cases, 21 Hospitalized; 382nd COVID-19-related Fatality Reported; Additional COVID-19 Updates**

**COVID-19 Test Results: 122 New Cases Reported**

Today, the Department of Public Health and Social Services (DPHSS) reported **122** new cases of COVID-19 from **1,434** specimens collected August 2, 2022. **Fourteen (14)** of the cases reported today are through the Department of Defense. To date, there have been a total of **55,746** officially reported cases, **382** deaths, **1,311** cases in active isolation, and **54,053** not in active isolation.

*SPECIAL NOTE: Based on today's data, if we were to compare two (2) hypothetical populations of 100,000 people each, vaccinated versus unvaccinated, there would be 11 vaccinated people hospitalized for COVID-19 compared to 46 unvaccinated people hospitalized for COVID-19. The risk of being hospitalized for COVID-19 is about 4 times higher for the unvaccinated as compared to the vaccinated. \*Estimated population is based on DPHSS Immunization Program analysis of 2020 Census data. Updates are expected pending further Census 2020 data breakdown.*

**382nd COVID-19-related Fatality Reported**

The Joint Information Center was notified that Guam’s 382nd COVID-19-related fatality occurred at the Guam Memorial Hospital on August 2, 2022. The patient was a 49-year-old male, fully vaccinated without a booster, with underlying health conditions, who tested positive on July 19 and again on August 1.

“Jeff, Josh, and I send our heartfelt condolences to his family,” said Governor Lou Leon Guerrero. “How we overcome this pandemic is dependent on our ability to remain consistent with our efforts to combat this virus. Please continue to wear your mask, especially in large crowds or while indoors around others, and stay home if you are sick. We can also keep up to date with our vaccinations and boosters.”

**DPHSS mAb Treatment Center Open at Paseo Stadium**

Bebtelovimab, a monoclonal antibody (mAb) for the treatment of mild-to-moderate COVID-19

in adults and pediatric patients (12 years of age and older weighing at least 40 kilograms) is available at the DPHSS mAb treatment center at the Paseo Stadium in Hagåtña from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., and closes for lunch from 12 p.m. to 1 p.m., Monday through Saturday.

To schedule treatment at the DPHSS mAb treatment center, patients must call 671-998-4527 or 671-998-4547, have a current, laboratory confirmed COVID-19 infection and a referral from a prescribing physician. ### COVID-19 Vaccines for Children 6 Months and Older Available at DPHSS CHCs

The Moderna and the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 Vaccines authorized for use in children down to six months of age. In most children, the Moderna COVID-19 vaccine for children ages six months through five years will be a two-dose primary series with four to eight weeks between dose one and dose two. In most children, the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine for children ages six months through four years will be a three-dose primary series three to eight weeks between dose one and dose two, and at least eight weeks between dose two and dose three.

COVID-19 vaccination for individuals ages six months and older is available at the DPHSS Northern Region Community Health Center in *Dededo*, and the DPHSS Southern Region

Community Health Center in *Inalåhan*. Requirements for minors to receive the Moderna or Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 Vaccine:

- Parent/legal guardian must provide minor's birth certificate
- Parent/legal guardian must have a government-issued photo identification
- Minor must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian
- Guardians must present legal guardianship or power-of-attorney documents

COVID-19 vaccination for individuals ages six months to 4 years of age is NOT available at the ASC vaccination clinic.

### **Incentives Offered for COVID-19 Vaccination Series Completion and Boosters**

A program administered by the government of Guam is providing incentives to individuals 12 years of age and older who maintain their COVID-19 vaccinations who are completing their last dose in primary series; OR receiving 1st Booster Dose OR 2nd Booster Dose

Eligible residents will be offered an incentive (alcohol and tobacco items excluded) *while supplies last*. **Gift certificates will only be offered at vaccination clinics at NRCHC, SRCHC, the Agana Shopping Center, and senior citizen outreach clinics, while supplies last.**

### **Guam COVID-19 Vaccination Update**

As of August 2, 2022, **139,495** eligible residents (6 months and older) are fully vaccinated. This total includes **14,312** residents 12 – 17 years old. **8,770** residents 5 – 11 years old received their first dose of a two dose series. **7,094** residents 5 – 11 years old have completed their two-dose series. **103** residents 6 months – 4 years old have received their first dose of a two dose series. **67,421** eligible residents have received their first booster shots. **11,119** eligible residents have received their second booster shots.
