Guam in COR 2; School Updates; Shelter Information will be Provided Tomorrow; Guam Legislature Closed; Judicial Court Closed; GSWA Update; Healthcare Updates

Governor Lou Leon Guerrero has placed Guam in Condition of Readiness (COR) 2 at 8 p.m. this evening. At COR2, the Government of Guam, with the exception of essential services, will not be operational and will remain closed until COR 4 is announced.

Joint Region Marianas (JRM), Naval Base Guam (NBG), Andersen Air Force Base (AAFB), and Marine Corps Base Camp Blaz (MCBCB) are also in Tropical Cyclone Condition of Readiness (TCCOR) 2 at 8 p.m. this evening. The Department of Defense (DoD) has delayed implementing some of the TCCOR2 actions until Tuesday, May 23, to minimize impact to installation services (Child Development Center, Exchange, Commissary, etc.). As of 5 p.m., Tropical Storm Mawar was located 7.4 degrees north latitude and 148.1 degrees east longitude, about 255 miles west of Chuuk, 475 miles south-southeast of Guam, and 555 miles south-southeast of Saipan. It is moving north at 8 mph with maximum sustained winds of 60 mph.

A typhoon watch remains in effect for Guam, Rota, Tinian, and Saipan. A typhoon watch means that typhoon conditions are possible, with tropical storm force (sustained winds of 39 mph and greater) conditions arriving within the next 48 hours. There is an increasing likelihood for tropical storm to typhoon force impacts around midweek. The anticipated timing is expected between late Tuesday to early Thursday. Heavy rainfall is likely much of this week, with 9 to 15 inches remaining a possibility through the end of this week.

School Updates:

- The Guam Department of Education (GDOE) Central Office operations and school sites will be closed:
 - There are no GDOE classes Monday, May 22. GDOE schools that have been identified as emergency shelters will be operational for shelter by 5 p.m. Monday.
 - The Guam Education Board Meeting scheduled for Tuesday, May 23 has been RESCHEDULED to Tuesday, May 30, 5 p.m.
- DoDEA schools will remain OPEN on Monday, May 22.
- The Archdiocese of Agana, Catholic School classes have been canceled for Monday, May 22, and the Catholic schools will remain closed until COR 4 is announced.
- The University of Guam will be closed Monday, May 22, and will not be open until COR 4 is announced.
- The Guam Community College will be closed Monday, May 22, and will not be open until COR 4 is announced.

Shelter Information will be Provided Tomorrow:

The GDOE is preparing to open certain emergency shelters at 5 p.m. on Monday, May 22. More information regarding locations, rules and regulations will be provided tomorrow morning. **Emergency shelters will NOT** be open until tomorrow. Do not attempt to go to any emergency shelter until the designated opening time.

Guam Legislature Operations Closed Tomorrow:

Upon declaration of COR 2, the Guam Legislature will be closed for public services until COR 4 is restored.

Judicial Court Closed Tomorrow:

The Judiciary of Guam announced the closure of the Judicial Branch upon declaration of COR 2 this evening, until the declaration of COR 4 by the Governor of Guam. All hearings, jury trials, jury selections, and grand jury proceedings will be rescheduled.

GSWA Update:

The Guam Solid Waste Authority (GSWA) will continue operations with trash pick up tomorrow, May 22. Assessments will be made after tomorrow and an update on GSWA operations for the remainder of the week will be provided.

United Flights Operational Tomorrow:

United flights will operate as scheduled on Monday, May 22, 2023, and the United City Ticket Office will be open from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. United customers who are scheduled to depart May 23 and May 24 are encouraged to check <u>united.com</u> or the United app for the most current flight information as a result of Tropical Storm Mawar.

Correction to Guam Memorial Hospital Authority Update:

On Monday afternoon, May 22, 2023, Guam Memorial Hospital Authority (GMHA) will announce the time that pregnant mothers may begin coming to the hospital.

When that time is announced, GMHA will begin receiving pregnant mothers who are thirty-six (36) weeks or more along and all high-risk pregnant mothers who are twenty-four (24) weeks or more in their pregnancy.

Correction to GRMC Update:

The Guam Regional Medical City (GRMC) will maintain regular operating and visiting hours until 8:00 pm on Monday, May 22, 2023. Should weather conditions worsen within 24 hours after the announcement of Condition of Readiness (COR) 2, GRMC will then announce the suspension of visiting hours.

The GRMC Lung and Infectious Diseases (GLID) Clinic has converted physical appointments to Telehealth until further notice. All other outpatient appointments and elective surgeries scheduled on Monday, May 22, 2023, will be contacted for rescheduling accordingly.

During suspension, all visitors, except patient watchers, will be asked to leave the hospital.

All admitted patients may have one (1) patient watcher. Patient watchers must obtain an approved emergency patient watcher badge from Customer Relations in the Main Lobby. Note, patient watchers are encouraged to bring food (that does not require refrigeration) for the duration of the storm. Meals will only be provided to patients.

What should you do:

The community is advised to finish the following preparedness actions by tomorrow:

- Stay up to date monitor local news, National Weather Service and the Joint Information Center;
- Put up shutters. Do not wait for winds to increase by Tuesday;

- Clear loose debris around your yard and store any items that may become airborne with heavy winds such as canopies, tarps and trampolines, before inclement weather arrives;
- Keep emergency preparedness kits readily available, with battery operated radio, flashlights and extra batteries;
- Secure important documents such as birth certificates, tax papers, and insurance documents and keep copies in a water-proof bag;
- Unplug all appliances and ensure energy breakers are switched off once damaging winds approach;
- If you live in an area prone to flooding, cover beds and furniture with plastic to prevent water damage;
- Ensure pets are part of your emergency plans (i.e. have enough supplies, bring them indoors, plan to keep them with a loved one or family member);
- Do not camp, park, or hike along streams, rivers, and creeks. These areas can flood quickly and with little warning;
- Gas your vehicles and get fuel for your generators now while the weather is clear;
- When you're done securing your homes and you know someone elderly, living with a disability, or who will otherwise need help, please see how you can help them. If you know a neighbor or family member who has no way of getting information about the storm, please let them know the updates.
