 DPHSS Issues 2021 COVID-19 Infection Trends Summary Report;

*SPECIAL NOTE: Based on today's data, if we were to compare two (2) hypothetical populations of 100,000 people each, vaccinated versus unvaccinated, there would be 2 vaccinated people hospitalized for COVID-19 compared to 23 unvaccinated people hospitalized for COVID-19. The risk of being hospitalized for COVID-19 is about 12 times higher for the unvaccinated as compared to the vaccinated. *Estimated population is based on DPHSS Immunization Program analysis of 2020 Census data. Updates are expected pending further Census 2020 data breakdown.*

COVID-19 Test Results: Seven New Cases of COVID-19

Today, the Department of Public Health and Social Services (DPHSS) reported **seven (7)** new cases of COVID-19 from **621** tests on December 21. **Five (5)** cases were identified through contact tracing. To date, there have been a total of **19,414** officially reported cases, **270** deaths, **231** cases in active isolation, and **18,913** not in active isolation. The CAR Score is **0.9**.

Guam COVID-19 Vaccination Update

As of December 21, a total of **128,516** of Guam's eligible population (residents 5 years and older) is fully vaccinated. This total includes **12,538** residents 12 – 17 years old. **4,454** residents 5 – 11 years old received their first dose of the Pfizer-BioNTech two dose series. **2,150** residents 5 – 11 years old have completed their two-dose series. An additional **682** residents received their booster shots and a total of **36,045** booster shots have been administered to eligible residents since September 29, 2021.

DPHSS Issues 2021 COVID-19 Infection Trends Summary Report

COVID-19 Booster Shot Eligibility

Adolescents 16 and 17 years of age who received a Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine (first two doses) are eligible for a single booster shot at least 6 months or more after their initial series. At this time, only the Pfizer-BioNTech booster vaccine is authorized and recommended for adolescents aged 16 and 17.

- Guardians must present legal guardianship or power-of-attorney documents
